The Town of Alpine is currently working on annexations of properties north of Town. Annexation is the process by which a municipality expands its boundaries into nearby areas not already incorporated into the municipality. The benefit of annexation is that it helps ensure the orderly and efficient delivery of services to areas which are developed to urban densities. The Town also receives additional revenues generated by an increased tax base. The primary benefit to the property owner is access to municipal services – mainly water and sewer. Once the properties are annexed into the Town they will be subject to all ordinances and building requirements/zoning that currently apply to Town of Alpine Residents.

The Town of Alpine serves residents and businesses through planning & zoning, permitting and building inspections. Town regulations protect property values and encourage the beautification of Alpine neighborhoods. We are committed to working with property owners to maintain neighborhood character and identity.

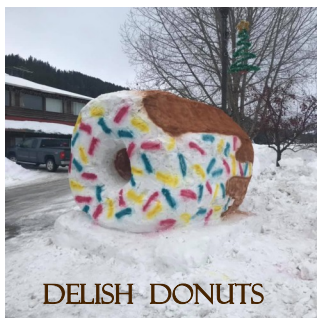
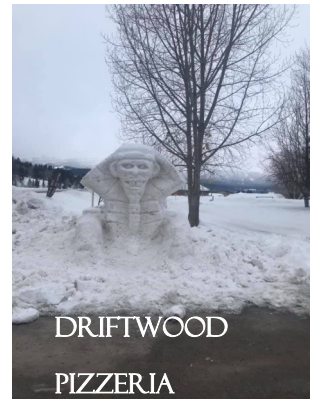
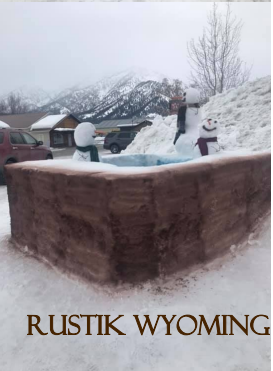

**BUSINESS LICENSES** are required within the incorporated boundaries of the Town of Alpine. Business Licenses are valid from **July 1—June 30th of each fiscal year**. Business Licenses are up for renewal on June 30th 2019.

**CREDIT CARDS** The Town of Alpine will now be accepting credit cards for all services/licenses/permits. There will be a 3% charge for all payments unrelated to water/sewer.

**OFFICE CLOSURES** Town of Alpine offices will be closed on the following dates.
